Selected Home-Made Gift Directions

Potpourri

4-oz. cinnamon sticks, broken in small pieces

3-oz. whole allspice

1-oz. whole cloves

1/2-oz. crushed nutmeg

1/2-oz. ginger

2-oz. orange peel, minced

12 drops each of cinnamon, allspice, and orange oil

Combine the spices and oils.

Place them in a covered container.

Allow the mixture to set for about 3 weeks.

Cut calico, tulle or lace into 4- or 5-inch squares or circles

Put 1/4 to 1/3 cup of the potpourri in the center of the cut-out fabric.

Gather the sides of the fabric.

Tie the top with a ribbon.

Play Dough

1 cup flour

1 tablespoon oil

1 cup water

½ cup salt

2 teaspoons cream of tartar

food coloring

Combine all ingredients in a saucepan.

Cook the mixture over medium heat.

Stir constantly until the mixture forms a ball.

Knead it until smooth.

Store play dough in a covered container.

Refrigerator Magnets

Use laminating sheets (available in the office supply department) to cover a special photo.

Trim excess laminating sheet.

Apply a peel-and-stick magnet (available in the crafts department) to the back of the laminated photo

Or, put the photo in an inexpensive plastic frame (without glass) and apply the magnet to the back of that frame.

Another variation

Print a list of words that people can use to form phrases and sentences on the fridge. It's fun to include silly things in the mix. Include nouns, adjectives, verbs, adverbs and words like "the," "and," "but," "if," "or," "why,' and "where" as well as punctuation.

Survival Kit

Put one of each of the following candy bars or packs of candy in a cellophane bag.

Print a card with the following explanation.

Punch a hole in the top corner of the card.

Run a ribbon through the hole and tie it to close the bag.

Flower Pens in a Vase or Pot

Select a variety of silk flowers and greenery to make a bouquet.

Use green floral tape to attach a simple ballpoint pen (you can discard the pen cap) to the stem of each silk flower or piece of greenery.

If using a clear vase, fill it with decorative glass pebbles or stones.

If using an opaque vase or pot, you can fill it with the decorative pebbles, uncooked rice or uncooked beans.

Arrange the flower pens into a bouquet in the pot or vase.

Sugar Body Scrub

1 clear glass jar
1 cup sugar
½ cup olive oil or grape seed oil scented essential oil label food coloring

Mix the sugar and oil in a bowl.

Add scent(s), if desired: e.g. peppermint or orange are refreshing; lavender is relaxing.

Add food coloring, if desired.

Put on a label with "Made by..." and "Shake before using."
